WSD Goals

Goal #1: College & Career Readiness

- The weekend of April 23-24, juniors Rainbow Chen and Ennis Horozovic along with Lucas Dunn worked with teams from other NMEF-related schools at the Youth Leadership Institute, UMass, Amherst. All three are helping plan and organize the annual summer Youth Leadership Conference.
- The WHS Aspirations Day, Tuesday, April 12, kicked off with a powerful presentation by Richard Haynes, renowned artist and Associate Director of Admissions at UNH that captivated our students and inspired many. A variety of workshops, college visits, and a panel presentation followed, and the day came to an energizing and affirming close with a "concert" by musician Jared Campbell!
- Our graduating seniors are doing their final edits in preparation for the Senior Expo presentations that will take place Friday, May 27. This is always a highlight for our school community, and a celebration of important communication skills for our students. This long-standing capstone event has been a key inspiration for the way we are approaching our six GXs, with students intentionally building GX skills throughout their schooling and engaging in practice expos multiple times each year, concluding in a capstone project for each GX. We're building on our strengths!
- SBAC testing has been completed for the district, except for a few makeups that need to be completed. The SBAC test reports should be available for school review by mid-June with scores being released to the public by the AOE some time this summer.
- Mary Beth from Vermont Reads institute came to meet with the JFK leadership team. We reviewed the results of the Literacy Audit that she conducted with the teachers in December and January. Some of the major themes that emerged were that people feel strongly that there is genuine mutual respect, that teachers are eager to share resources with each other, teachers have common planning time, that the school is developing a shared vision for literacy, and that we are working on developing a common language for literacy instruction. Overall the results were incredibly positive, and reinforced that we are moving in the right direction as a staff.

Goal #2: Healthy, Productive & Successful Lives

• The WMHS Marching Band joined several dozen school bands from around Vermont in the All State Music Parade held in St. Albans Wednesday, May 4. One of our staff members was jumping up and down with excitement and pride as our students marched by! We have much to appreciate regarding the arts in Winooski! Rainbow Chen and Thong (Key) Nguyen are participating in the All State Music Festival May 5 and 6, with the culminating concert being held at Missisquoi Valley Union High School Saturday, May 7 @ 2pm.

Goal #3: Local & Global Community Engagement

• A team of 11 high school students from the Climate and Energy class with Steve Crowley spent months collaborating with students from around Vermont planning the Youth

Climate Rally, held April 28 in Montpelier. After many hours of meetings, collaboration, problem solving, and persistence, our team helped make a successful event happen. Congratulations to Tiffany Phuong, Holly Turner, Andy Siki, Olivier Enwa, Musa Mayange, Abdi Ali Mohamed, Mayange Mayange, OoMai Be, ThaZin Aye, and Anju Pokwal.

- Once again, Winooski students are joining Green Up Day activities on Saturday, May 7. Shannon Bundy is coordinating the activities that will center on cleaning the school grounds and streets nearby. We're proud of our community and our school, and this is a fun way to help keep it beautiful!
- Kindergarten screening was on May 6th and May 9th. All four of next year's kindergarten teachers worked together to screen the students. In addition, families were given information about summer and the new placement process for kindergarten.

Finance/Operations

- At the end of April, our fund balance for FY16 is favorably forecasted at \$6K or less than .05 % of the voter-approved budget.
- The balance of the Reserve Fund is currently \$490,332 which reflects the encumbered expense for high school removable walls and replacement of the walk in cooler/freezer.
- Our summer food service program will run from June 13 to August 5 2016 (no service on 7/4) at WSD. Breakfast and Lunch each day. The site is open for any child/student 18 years old or younger at no cost. The Abbey Group will provide the service.
