# **Goal #1:** College & Career Readiness

- WMS Newcomers celebrated their Expedition *Migration Stories* with a planting party. Students partnered with the Audubon Center and studied Vermont birds and migration patterns as a way into reflecting on their own "migration stories". They will be here for the whole day gathering footage for a National Personal Finance Documentary. They are filming at four schools in the country, and Winooski was specially chosen to be part of the filming!

Not only was he accepted to this week long international program, but he received a \$1,000 scholarship to pay for the tuition. Here are the details of the program! It looks amazing! - **Hurray, Alia!** Every year in March Vermont high school students are invited to test their mathematical skills while participating in the *Vermont High School Prize Examination* sponsored by the University of Vermont. The exam challenges students to solve problems in the areas of Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry, Probability, and other Complex Systems. This year, five Winooski high school students took the test, and Alia Ross, for the second year in a row, received The Best in School award. Last year Alia, as an eighth grade student, was given permission to join her high school peers in taking the exam. She made the most of this opportunity, scoring well above the Winooski average. This year as a first year high school student she continued to impress by improving her previous year's score by a whopping 57%. Congratulations to Alia and to all the WHS students who challenged themselves on the statewide stage.
- Each JFK grade level of teachers met for a half day with Ali Brown from 2Revolutions to begin work on their PBL projects for the 2019-20 school year. The work that they did to deepen the understanding in the projects was amazing.
- This summer JFK Summer School with be partnering with KPMG for a "Read to Succeed" summer program. All students that participate will get new books to take home. In addition, students that read over the summer will earn prizes.

# **Finance/Operations**

- At the end of May our fund balance for FY19 is favorably forecasted at \$67K or .39 % of the voter-approved budget. We have made assumptions in several areas such as Substitutes Expenses and Health Reimbursement Accounts (HRA).
- The budget for Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA) for FY19 is \$478,374. We have expended \$425,289 or 89% of the budget with one month remaining.
- The projected balance of the Capital Reserve Fund is currently \$260K. The Vermont State Board of Education will review our application for emergency construction aid at their June meeting. The district has requested
  - \$41k (30% is allowable of the total cost of \$138K). This money will be deposited back into the Capital Reserve Account.
- The bid for the food service contract has been received and a recommendation will be made at the meeting.
