
PBiS

JFK is starting our 5th year as a PBiS school. PBiS stands for Positive Behaviors Interventions and Supports. Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is an evidence-based three-tiered framework to improve and integrate all of the data, systems, and practices affecting student outcomes every day. PBIS creates schools where all students succeed.



Tier 1 is meant for all students. It practices encompases teaching across all settings. This tier establishes the foundation for regular, proactive delivering instruction and support. Tier 1 emphasizes prosocial skills and expectations by teaching and acknowledging expected behavior.

Tier 2 practices and systems support provide targeted students who are not successful with Tier 1 supports alone. The focus is on early interventions and support for students. Essentially, the support at this level is more focused than Tier 1 and less intensive than Tier 3. Tier 2 practices stem from a strong foundation of Tier 1 support. With school-wide systems in place, we are able to identify which students need additional support.

Our school expectations are a key part to our PBiS program. During the first six weeks of school, students and adults go over what the HEART expectations look and sound like in the school for different locations and activities.

Throughout the day, adults acknowledge students for following the school expectations. As a school, we use plastic HEARTS as our acknowledgement token.

This year teachers acknowledge the student verbally and then put the HEART token directly into the class jar. Students do not touch the HEARTS. When a class fills their class jar they have a class celebration, their class is announced over the intercom, and a part of our school HEART gets filled in. Once our entire school HEART gets filled in, we will have an all school celebration!

In years past, class celebrations have included things like pajama day, time on ipads/chromebooks, dance parties, or playing games. All school celebrations have included things like a school wide movie, school wide bingo, and crazy hair/hat day.
