# **Vision Screenings**

More than 12 million school-age children in the United States have some form of vision problem, yet only one in three have received eye care services before age six. Many vision problems run the risk of becoming permanent if not corrected by age seven when the eye reaches full maturity. Vision also plays an important role in education. According to educational experts, 80 percent of learning is visual. Vermont Lions provide free vision screenings to schools, early childhood centers, nursery schools, and daycare centers. The actual screening takes less than a minute, but the benefits can last a lifetime. The Lions Clubs of Vermont purchased Welch Allen spot vision cameras to conduct vision screenings.

• 80% of learning is visual

- Vision problems undetected by age 7 can become permanent
- Screening children 6 months to 6 years of age provides early detection.
- Every Child deserves to see the world clearly!

Early screening leads to early detection, which helps ensure that children get the follow-up care they need. We want to make sure that correctible vision problems don't stand in the way of our children learning and seeing the world clearly. The Lions Club will beat JFK on October 12th to screen vision for students in grades K, 1, 3, and 5.
