## **JFK Parent Teacher Conferences**

On November 17th and 18th, JFK will have our fall parent-teacher conferences. Fall conferences are a great way to share information about your student, talk about how they are adjusting to the new school year, share any celebrations, and ask any questions you may have.

Fall conferences are also a time for your student's teacher to share how your student is doing in school so far. As a school, we strive to educate the whole child. This means that your student's teacher will share how they are doing academically, socially, and emotionally.

One assessment that your student's teacher will share with you is the DIBELS. DIBELS stands for *Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills*. All students, grades K-5, are given the DIBELS. This assessment is used to measure how students are doing on important reading skills. The entire assessment is fast, each part of the test only takes about a minute. The information we get from the assessment is invaluable and helps to guide our instruction and intervention for students.

As you get ready to come to conferences, talk to your student about how school is going, and any questions or concerns they may have. Our students are the most successful when home and school
