- I am traveling to Los Alamos, New Mexico, over the weekend and returning to campus on Wednesday August 16. As a board member of the Los Alamos National Laboratory Foundation, I attend annual board retreats and quarterly board meetings in person. I participate via Zoom for any other business. The WSD board will be notified ahead of my travel
- As a member of the Champlain Valley Superintendent's Association (CVSA) I attended a gathering on 8/3 and will be attending the first official convening on 9/08.
- I continue to meet biweekly (or weekly) with Elaine Wang, City Manager.
- The Ed Justice Coalition organized a Social Justice Camp for youth and some Winooski students were a part of it. I attended their end-of-camp showcase on July 27.
- I will be volunteering the evening of Friday August 11 for the BIPOC Summer Camp in Starksboro, VT.

GENERAL AND OPERATIONAL UPDATES

- FY 23 Budget: At the close of June, we are projecting a modest surplus of \$145,635 or 0.68% of the operating budget. This outlook improved since the close of Q3, largely due to lower-than-anticipated expenses for winter sports programs, revised transportation expense projections, personnel changes, and special education extraordinary reimbursements. Based on these changes, the district will not need the additional \$134,000 from the fund balance at the close of the FY. [4]
- We are thrilled to have Miriam Greenfield now with us, our new Communications Director. She brings a wealth of experience and skills and is excited to begin the work in support of our educational community. [3, 4]
- The Facilities Team has been working diligently this summer performing preventative maintenance work on all systems in the building including (a) learning our new modernized HVAC system; (b) maintaining our new beautiful landscaping around the District as well to ensure everything looks inviting for the community upon returning for the upcoming School Year and (c) deepcleaning the entire campus from top to bottom and finishing up with shampooing the carpets for a fresh clean look. - IT has been busy carrying out system updates for instruction and student experience, taking care of the needs of all new staff or staff with new roles and setting up equipment for the FY24 school year. A distribution plan is already underway. [1-4]
- I carried out a preliminary audit of the policy work that
 has been done over the past few years in the district and
 mapped a plan moving forward. A screenshot of the
 plan is on the next page, but a formal presentation of
 this work will take place at a future board meeting or
 during this one if questions arise during today's First

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Preview of the current policy review cycle audit for a preliminary proposal on policy work for the year. A more thorough discussion and analysis of the plan is upcoming, but you are welcome to ask questions during the policy portion of today's meeting.

TEACHING AND LEARNING UPDATES

- We and our literacy partner, The Stern Center, just received a \$25,000 Nellie Mae grant to run a pilot after-school literacy lab. This lab will provide direct PD on adolescent literacy to Winooski teachers. The teachers will in turn use what they learned to work with a group of up to 30 students after school to improve the student's reading skills. [1]
- This summer, we invested significantly in High-Quality Instructional Materials (HQIM). We purchased new high school algebra and geometry programs (Reveal Math), a new 9th grade ELA program (Common Lit), a new French Program (Chemins), new middle and elementary math supports through All Learners Network, a new digital practice platform for reading and math k-8 (Freckle) and updated SEL program materials (Second Step). Each of these investments moves toward our goal of having an aligned and articulated curriculum at WSD. [1,2]

TEACHING AND LEARNING UPDATES (CONTINUED)

- We completed 4 weeks of summer school. Students in incoming grades K-5 had the opportunity to come for one two-week session this summer. Summer school consisted of high-quality literacy and math instruction and was well attended. [1-3]
- The JFK leadership team attended BEST in June. They attended the Everyday Equity strand and are bringing some fantastic learning back to the entire JFK staff. [2]
- Early Learning has been reviewing data on its first-year implementation of The Creative Curriculum. This information has been used this summer to create quality inservice training to support early education teachers on how to integrate learning in literacy, math, science, social studies, and the arts throughout the day. - To adhere to the licensing ratio regulations, we are continuing to recruit and hire more early learning staff. Currently, we need to fill four support staff positions and two teacher positions. [1-3]
- This past school year the high school community engaged in a collaborative conference for our NEASC accreditation. The visiting team of educators reviewed the report that was written by staff and participated in a multi-day visit to meet with all stakeholders of our school. A report was received at the end of the school year with encouraging commendations and recommendations, including praise for the school's "deep and respectful knowledge of its community and families." - The Barr Foundation has approved a \$250,000 grant to Winooski Public Schools to support Winooski Middle High School as part of the sustainability phase of the Wider Learning Ecosystem cohort. Key priorities for this investment are informed by our NEASC accreditation collaborative conference this past school year which, among other things, includes implementing and refining structures that clearly and transparently communicate student performance in all coursework and their progress towards graduation.
