Medical Emergency

On Thursday one of our students experienced a medical emergency during lunch in the cafeteria. Our dedicated staff, nurses, and the WSD Medical Response Team acted swiftly to provide the necessary care. While we ensured the student's privacy and limited other students' exposure to the situation, some students in close proximity may have witnessed the response.

If your student saw or heard about the emergency and has concerns or questions, here are some tips to help guide your conversations:

- Keep explanations simple and age-appropriate. Provide just enough detail to help them understand, without overwhelming them.
- Encourage them to ask for help if needed. Let them know it's okay to express their feelings and seek guidance from trusted adults.
- Discuss the importance of calling 911 in an emergency. Explain that emergencies require quick action, and calling for help is a key step.
- Reassure them that most medical emergencies can be managed by adults. Remind them that our school staff are well-trained and prepared for such events.
- Highlight our emergency response plan. Let them know that the school has a clear plan in place to handle emergencies and keep everyone safe.

We are proud of how well the students listened to adults and followed directions during this incident. If your child has any lingering concerns, please feel free to reach out to us for further support.
